### **Reports from Town Board Members and Department Heads**

Councilman Best gives kudos to the Buildings and Grounds Department for their help with the 5K run this past weekend. Both the Town Park and Woodlawn Beach facilities were involved. There were over 900 runners and there were many compliments on the facilities, especially the Town Park.

Councilman Quinn – no report

Supervisor Walters – no report

Rick Lardo, Principal Engineering Assistant, reports that the Mt. Vernon Sewer Project is out for bid. They submitted again to the State on the Quiet Zones, they are moving along and hopefully this is the last submittal.

Ted Casey, Traffic Safety Coordinator, gives an update on the Traffic light on Route 5 in front of the Hamburg Town Park stating that it is a State run, owned and operated light. The State contacted him today to say that the work was given to a contractor that filed Chapter 11, so they have been focused on bigger projects, i.e. Fed Ex, to try and stay solvent. The State will be checking the lights to see if they are working properly. The light at Pleasant Ave and Old Lakeshore Road is still in the queue. The State has no control over when the contractor will finish the work.

Supervisor Walters questions whether the Town could contract out with the State?

Mr. Casey responds that he asked that questions and they said probably not without a legal issue.

Superintendent Best comments that he offered to take over the maintenance on that light and he was told no because of the liability factor.

Superintendent Best reports that he has two major concerns that he will send in a written report to the Town Board shortly. One is the docks at the Town Park. The rough weather recently has caused damage to the one dock that cost \$3500 to remove a pylon. He has not replaced it because of the cost. His other concern is the Senior Center HVAC System. He is going to get estimates to get these items fixed and bring it before the Board.

Sean Crotty, Emergency Management Coordinator, reports that fireworks permits will now be placed on the website. There have been some complaints and they are trying to be proactive about this. There are a lot of residents with PTSD and hyper-sensitive pets that react to the fireworks displays. Residents can check the website for dates and times and make other arrangements in order to avoid it.

Marty Denecke, Director of Youth, Recreation and Senior Services, reports for the Youth Bureau that they received a \$10,000 grant from the Erie County Youth Bureau. This is a prime time grant which is going to be used for their mentoring program. For Recreation, the summer youth recreation programs will kick-off on June 27<sup>th</sup>. Registration remains open and they recently received a \$1,500 grant from the U.S. Tennis Assoc. for the summer youth tennis program. On Senior Services, they have begun a program called the Aging Mastery Program, in cooperation with Erie County, it is through a grant and the County is providing many of the resources including speakers. It is a speaker series and they will reimburse the Town for any other related expenses.

### **Business from the Floor**

Jim Morgan comments that according to the Hamburg Sun the conclusion to the Quiet Zones seems to be coming up rapidly. He is confused on the Bayview Road Quiet Zone as to whether or not they plan to do it. It seems that they are talking about closing the road and then it would no longer be necessary to put the Quiet Zone in. There has been talk of closing that road since 1977. The Fire Department and Police Department seem to be against that.

The last time he talked to the town about this they promised to get the Bayview Road Quiet Zone done and the amount of money left was around \$325,000 and that was more than enough to get all three Quiet Zones done without any complications. What is the status on that?

Supervisor Walters responds that what they told him a year ago is that there was more than enough money to complete the studies for the three closings. All three closings have been going through the process. Last summer the Town Board passed a resolution asking the Traffic Safety Board to start the investigatory process for the closing of Bayview Road. They have numerous things going, all heading towards the same goal of creating a quiet zone. They have received preliminary input from the NYSDOT and the railroad that said that they would be supportive of closing Bayview Road. They are still working to get the Quiet Zone on Bayview Road but they are looking at it from two different options.

Mr. Morgan and Supervisor Walters discuss the history of numerous proposed closings of Bayview Road and how it would affect the new Lake Erie Commerce Center.

Councilman Best comments that there is a shortage of funds to complete all three Quiet Zones. That is why they are working on the first two and Bayview would probably be the third to be completed.

Gloria Engler comments that she has a beach easement/access to Woodlawn Beach. Since the State and Town have both taken over they have joined both creeks. She has two entrances, one on Lake and one on 7<sup>th</sup> Street that go directly to a creek where she has to cross 4 ft. across and 5 ft. deep of polluted water to get to the beach. She has had meetings with Assemblyman Sean Ryan, Senator Panepinto and the management at Woodlawn Beach and there has been no resolution. They have curved the creeks in such a manner as to take up their easement and shrink their beach. She has to purchase flood insurance which hasn't been necessary for a long time. They have dumped piles of contaminated dirt on their beach in order to clean up Woodlawn.

Paul Engler comments that anyone who owns a lot in Woodlawn has beach access but they no longer have a beach, they have destroyed it.

The Engler's, Supervisor Walters and Superintendent Best discuss this issue.

Joe Kilian comments that the direction of the creeks stayed the same forever. It is just recently that the direction has changed.

John McKendry asks for an update on the Quiet Zones.

Mr. Lardo responds that hopefully they can still bid the project in July and it should go quickly after that.

Mr. McKendry then comments that there is a problem at Legion and Camp road and it is narrowing down to enforcement at this point. They are transporting (1267) crude oil, which is highly explosive and a violation of two codes. (1268) crude oil is a less explosive oil and there are train cars parked there now. He photographed trains cars noting (1269), which to his knowledge doesn't exist. There are also cars with no number on them. Whoever owns that company is in total violation because, according to the law, you cannot unload anything that is explosive. Once this is loaded onto semi-trucks they should be properly marked and monitored. Who would enforce the violation of the two codes that he pointed out?
